The arts mean business

Portland Institute for Contemporary Art (PICA) is one of 193 local arts organizations that participated in the study. Last year PICA's TBA Festival attracted 23,000 patrons, including 5,000 out-of-town visitors.

We all know that arts organizations add tremendous value to our community. Now, we have powerful information that helps quantify their significant contributions to the local economy.

Arts & Economic Prosperity IV, released last month by Americans for the Arts, RACC and Business for Culture and the Arts (BCA), reveals that the nonprofit arts and culture industry in Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington Counties generates more than \$253 million in annual economic activity. This spending supports 8,529 full-time equivalent jobs and generates more

than \$21 million for state and local government coffers – which more than doubles the amount that state and local governments invest in nonprofit arts organizations.

The study examined the budgets of 193 nonprofit arts organizations in Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington Counties. These arts organizations have combined budgets of \$152 million, which they use to purchase goods and services in the community, as well as to hire staff and artists – supporting 5,397 full time equivalent jobs in 2010.

The study also looked at event-related spending by audiences, and found that the average arts patron spends \$21.84 per person per event above and beyond the cost of admission – supporting local restaurants, parking garages and retail shops. Multiply that by the total attendance at arts and culture events in 2010 (4,640,262) and that adds more than \$101.5 million more of arts-related economic impact in the community.

The arts are also proven drivers of tourism – more than 16% of all attendees were visitors from out of town – and nearly 70% of those surveyed said that the primary reason for their trip was “specifically to attend this arts/culture event.” Visitors who stay overnight in a local hotel spend an average of \$154.79 per person as a direct result of their attendance.

Similar studies were conducted in 182 communities nationwide by Americans for the Arts, RACC, BCA, and the Creative Advocacy Network (CAN) contributed time and other support, including the collection of local data. The full report is available online at www.racc.org/aep4.

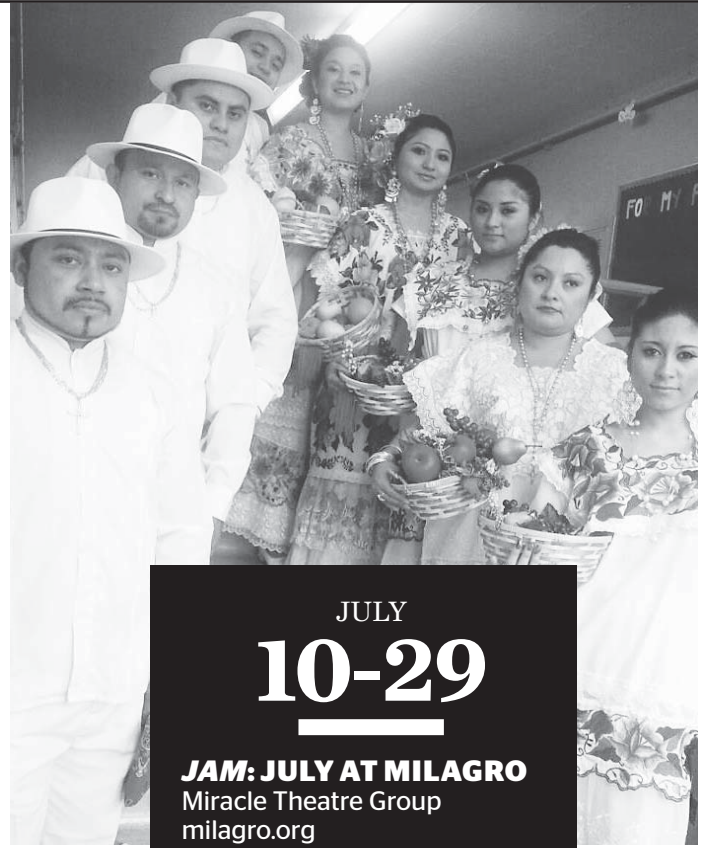
