**Project Scope:** One artist/artist team will be selected to create a series of mid-size, 3-dimensional, site-specific, exterior sculptural artworks which will be installed along the new south side entry path and within the new interior courtyard **Project Budget:** \$125,000

## More About the Library Capital Building Projects

The renovation and expansion of Albina Library is part of the first phase of the Library Capital Building Projects. Approved by voters in 2020, the building project includes expansions and renovations to seven branch libraries; building a destination library in East County; adding gigabit speed internet to all libraries; and creating a materials handling and distribution center, also known as the Operations Center. Based on the <u>Multhomah County Library (MCL) project</u> <u>sequencing</u>, all building projects are anticipated to be completed by the end of 2025/beginning of 2026. Some of the first projects include Albina, North Portland, Midland and Holgate libraries.

The new Multhomah County Library Operations Center was the first real estate purchase for these projects. This building leads the way for the additional building projects and will be located near the intersection of NE Glisan and NE 122nd Ave, approximately 8 blocks from Midland Library, in east Portland, Oregon. After the Operations Center, Albina Library will be one of the first locations to reopen, currently scheduled for Spring 2025. The exterior and interior Sculpture Series at Albina Library is one of several public art elements intended for the revised site.

Since the scope of the building project is substantial and will impact different communities with different needs, MCL has made a strong <u>commitment to community engagement</u> throughout this process to ensure that each community will be authentically engaged in the building and service design of each library. Additionally, the building project is being guided by <u>Capital Planning Project Principles</u> which include equity, accessibility for all and community partnership. As part of this work towards equity and inclusion, the architecture teams for many of these projects are being led by women of color.

## More About the North Portland Library Project Team

As part of the Library Capital Building Projects, North Portland Library renovations are being led by Multnomah County Library. Construction is being overseen and coordinated in conjunction with <u>Andersen Construction</u>. RACC is stewarding the public art elements allocated by Multnomah County's Percent for Art Program.

The North Portland Library design team includes <u>LEVER Architecture</u> and <u>Noll & Tam Architects</u>.
